Goal: Copper Mountain Middle is dedicated to increasing students proficiency levels in all tested areas. We feel that the establishment and operation of our Professional Learning Community is the most viable research based system to do so. Our goal for the 2019-20 school year is to raise proficiency levels in Science, Mathematics, and Language Arts on the RISE test by 5%, and to achieve mastery level for all other subjects on department common assessments. Almost the entire salary and benefits section of the land trust money is dedicated to the school's effort in the establishment of its professional learning community and professional development. We will focus on learning, collaboration, and using data to guide our high quality instruction to progressively improve each year. Teachers will use professional development days to: collaborate, analyze assessment data, plan remediation efforts, attend professional conferences, and participate in district provided training days. Additionally, money will be spent on a software program license to help improve reading levels for all students.
