Test Strategies

If your student is participating in either of these tests, we encourage students to simply do their very best. Students are not graded on these tests, but the tests provide valuable information to let us know how your student is doing and what instruction is needed for the following year. Help your student by ensuring they receive adequate sleep the night before (at least 8 hours). A healthy breakfast and proper hydration is also helpful on testing days. Students will be allowed to take a break to get a drink of water, use the restroom, or eat a snack if needed. Teachers will be informed of your student's participation in either test and will be excused from any classes missed. They will need to work with their teachers to make up any homework, instruction, or assessments missed during the test. We will make sure your student will get lunch and will get back to class as soon as possible.

Testing

WIDA Access Test

The WIDA ACCESS test is given yearly to English Language Learners in all grades PreK-12. The assessments measure students' academic English language. The results are used to determine the student's growth and progress, as well as to inform instruction for the next year.

NAEP Test

The National Assessment of Educational Progress—also called The Nation's Report Card. The results provide educators, policymakers, elected officials, and parents across the country with invaluable information regarding how our children are doing compared to other children in participating large urban districts, other states, and the nation. Schools are elected to participate in the NAEP test every few years. This year it is Copper Mountain Middle school's turn. Students in 8th grade will be randomly selected to participate. A letter will be sent home with more information if your student has been selected to participate.



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
