3. 1st Quarter Data
 - a. Reviewed failing classes for 7th/8th/9th grade students
 - b. About 10% of student population has 1 or more F
 - c. Data is relatively similar from previous school year



- i. ELL 7th grade students has increased though from 2 to 16 total students
 - ii. Absenteeism has decreased significantly for 7th graders
 - iii. For all grades tracking data for students with more than 1 F, have an IEP/504, learning English or absent more than 5 days
4. Student Awards and Recognitions

 - c. Honor Roll - 481 total students (45% of student body)
 - d. 4.0 Club - 19% of students
 - e. Triple Crown - 1.5% of students
 - i. 4.0
 - ii. Perfect Attendance
 - iii. All H's (citizenship)
 - f. Tardies continue to decrease this year (about half of what they were last year) with new tardy policy in place
5. Trust Lands and TSSA review and updates
 - a. Sharing "F" student data as implementing Trust Land funds to help facilitate an increase in school academic achievement
 - b. Goal: Raise proficiency levels in science, mathematics, and language arts on the Utah RISE and ASPIRE tests by 2%
 - c. Most of Trust Lands funds paying for salaries/benefits to help support students in these academic goals
 - d. TSSA budget works with Trust Lands budget. Use TSSA budget to also support social/emotional wellness and social science classes.
 - i. Kids take SEL survey 3x a year and it was the highest it has been that we've seen in the fall student survey data
 - ii. This budget pays for instructional assistants, extra counselor, extended coach contracts, student initiatives, 7th period allocations, professional development
