- 1. Welcome- Sarah welcomes members and calls the meeting to order.
 - a. Minutes form the last meeting are online

MOTION: To approve the minutes from the last meeting was made by Heidi Clayton. 2nd by Ami Swallow. Voting was unanimous in favor.

- 2. Guest Presentation to the Council- Andrea Moore
 - a. The Bully Project
 - i. Multi-tier program to address bullying
 - ii. Emphasis on communication skills
 - iii. Provides tools to parents and educators
 - iv. Keys to implementation are: school climate survey, action plan with faculty and staff, begin program, evaluate and re-assess
- 3. Update on 2nd Quarter Grades
 - a. Number of F's decreased in 7th grade
 - b. 8th and 9th grades have improved from last year
- 4. Trust Land Review 2017-2018- Principal Curtis
 - a. Salaries and Benefits \$65,000 (\$29,170 currently spent)
 - i. Tutoring hours are down, not as many students are taking advantage of it possibly due to the number of bussing students
 - b. Professional Development \$18,000 (\$9,094 currently spent)
 - c. Equipment \$45,000 (\$36,128 currently spent)
 - i. Network upgrades have been done by the district, but they are still seeking ways to improve the network
 - d. Total Budget \$128,000
- 5. Land Trust Proposal 2018-2019- Principal Curtis
 - a. School goals are to improve assessment scores by 5% on SAGE tests and meet mastery level on department assessments, help teachers with professional

- development, provide time to look at data, bridge the gap with students who are behind, hire a 17-hour aide to support struggling students
- b. Salaries and benefits \$80,000 for tutoring and extension programs
- c. Professional development \$15,000
- d. Equipment \$55,000 for Chromebooks and carts
- e. Total Budget \$150,000 (may possibly increase, pending additional funding) MOTION: To approve the 2018-2019 Land Trust Budget was made by Katherine Harbaugh. 2nd by Sarah Scherbel. Voting was unanimous in favor.
- 6. Update on Student Recognition- Principal Curtis
 - a. More than half of the students are on the honor roll
- 7. Counseling Center Report- Principal Curtis (on behalf of Melisa Christiansen)
 - a. 9th grade PCCR's are under way
 - b. College Week is coming up. The college fair will be on March 14th.
 - c. 7th grade orientation was well attended
- 8. Parking Lot Feedback
 - a. There are still some congestion issues with the drop-off areas.
 - b. The HAWK light system has been a positive change
 - c. Evening events have seen an increase in curb-side parking rather than use of the stalls. Emergency vehicle access is a priority. The school will look into painting the curb and installing signage. UPD is willing to help enforce this area for the school.
- 9. Other Discussions
 - a. School Enrollment
 - i. Boundary changes are in the works with the construction of the new schools
 - ii. The school is currently using portables and looking at sharing rooms, and/or having teachers with 7th periods to avoid traveling teachers
 - iii. The school is also working to avoid 4 lunch sessions
 - 1. There has been difficulty staffing the cafeteria.
 - b. School Volunteers
 - i. Skylerts could be used to help find volunteers for the school
 - 1. Some training and guidelines would be needed for volunteers
 - c. School Programs
 - i. The school leadership committee will meet on February 26th and can discuss school programs, such as an anti-bully campaign
